"THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD" FEBRUARY 2, 2025

FROM THE PASTORS DESK

Forty days after Christmas, the Church tells the story of the presentation of the infant Jesus in the Temple. It is an ancient feast that comes on a day that some people have taken to be one of the turning points of the year. Even our "Groundhog Day" tradition testifies that people have found that February 2 is a time to take a deep breath and think about the end of winter. So while darkness still holds more hours than daylight, there is every hope of spring. The Church has kept this feast with the place of worship full of lights: It is Candlemas (candle-Mass) Day!

The gospel story today tells us about the presentation of Jesus as a bridge toward the experience of his last supper, arrest, torture, death and resurrection. As we are eager to embrace the helpless Christ child during the Christmas holidays, we're being prepared to embrace Christ on the cross and Christ the resurrected one. Simeon, an old man, receives the new light and the new life of Christ into his arms. Simeon – the old man and the old world, the broken and sinful humanity – at long last can see light at the end of the tunnel. No longer will the world live in darkness. The dayspring from on high has brought light to the gloom that surrounds us.

This is no glib message. Simeon, the old, must die to the new. Death must precede resurrection. The sign of light must be contradicted by the darkness of the cross. We carry candles in our hands, just as Simeon carried the infant Light of the World – Jesus. We carry Christ into the wider world of our darkness and witness to it by lives outlined by the gospel.

Where is the darkness in our world? And just what is the "good news" that is ours to share? The answer to the second question is also the answer to the first. Our news is expressed in the commitment we make this day as the Body of Christ, dedicating our selves to right the injustices of the social order. We commit to fairness in our dealings with others, to sharing our material wealth with the poor, to raising our children in the church's tradition.

If we take the child Jesus into our arms like Simeon did, we commit ourselves to dying to the sin within us. What dark corners of our hearts still need to be illuminated by Christ's light? When are we petty? What are our addictions? Who do we need to reconcile with?

We have been Simeon – old, expectant, nearly lost in dark frustration, waiting for the promised redemption. We must now become Anna, coming forward at this time to give thanks to God. We must speak like Anna did about Christ's light to all who are waiting. We must reflect, radiate and shine the new light with such commitment and energy that none of us remains in darkness.

We are children of the light. May we never forget what we have seen and heard.

In the spirit of Anna and Simeon, may we fashion our parish family into a gathering where the light of Christ's peace is revealed in our works of prayer, community and service.
